The old Maid in hopes Longways for as many as will

Each strain twice

The 1st cu. cast off, the 1st man take his partner, first by the right, then left hand, lead her down the middle below the 3^d cu. and turn single - then cast up above the 3^d cu. cross up to the top - the 1st and 2^d cu. meet, turn back to back, clap hands twice, take hands back ward and go quite round - the 1st cu. flip down the middle, then the 1st and 2^d cu. take first right then left hands across with their partners, and turn quite round -
